Clint Edward Woodson, age 55 of Lubbock, A loving husband and father passed away peacefully at his home on Tuesday, November 3rd, 2020 after a long and hard-fought battle with cancer.

Clint Edward Woodson was born in Llano, Texas on July 27, 1965 to the late Shirley Jean Hartsfield Woodson and Charles Edward Woodson. He leaves behind wife Rebecca Woodson, children Caitlynn and husband Caleb Topham, Brice Gardner, Wyatt Woodson, Callie Woodson, and grandsons Owen and Jett Topham, siblings Keith and wife Cathy Woodson, Dee Dee Aktas, Chris and wife Michai Woodson, Cade and wife Sherry Woodson, Christi and husband Curtis Floyd, Clay Woodson, Cole Woodson, in-laws Tommy and Sue Morris, sisters and brothers-in-law Cindy and John Hall, Bryan and Sarah Morris, and many loving nieces, nephews, and cousins.

After graduating from high school in Sahuarita, Arizona, Clint joined the Air Force, serving honorably for 7 years 8 months and 8 days. He earned the rank of Staff Sargent as a Munitions System Specialist and Operations Resource Management Specialist, and he often shared memories of the time he spent in Germany while in the Air Force.

After leaving the military, Clint completed his Associate Degree at Tarrant County College in 1993, becoming a Registered Nurse, and then graduated

with a Bachelor's Degree in Nursing from Midwestern State University in 2004. He worked as a critical care and cath lab nurse before becoming a clinical specialist for Bard Electrophysiology where he enjoyed educating staff in EP labs across the country and Canada. He was the 2011 Clinical Specialist of the Year. Clint loved sharing his knowledge of EP and became a resource to many.

In addition to quality time spent with his family, Clint enjoyed being outdoors, scuba diving, traveling to the mountains, cruising in the Caribbean, target shooting, and dove hunting with his brothers. He will forever be remembered by the many adventures that we shared with him and by the many stories that will be re-told.
