She began working for Commercial Credit and then Ford Motor Credit Company, where she worked for thirty-six years before retiring in 2001. She came to know Jesus Christ as her Savior at the age of twenty-five. Throughout her days of attending church, she was a Sunday School teacher to young children and sang in the choir. In 2003 she moved to Spokane, WA to live with her daughter Dawn Schaffer and her family. She attended Faith Baptist Church faithfully. Upon the retirement of her son-in-law Mark from the United States Air Force, the family and Clydie moved to Wichita Falls, Texas in 2006. She then became a member of Victory Baptist Church.
