Donald "Don" Gene Logan, 76, of Lubbock, Texas, went to be with our Lord and Savior on Friday, December 6, 2024, at 3:08 p.m.

Don was born on February 9, 1948, in Roxton, Texas, to Clarence Logan Sr. and Virginia Logan. On September 2, 1966, he married the love of his life, Judy, and they celebrated 58 wonderful years of marriage. Together, they raised two daughters, Tonja and Tina, who were his pride and joy. Don loved his family and would do anything to keep them happy, healthy, and protected, even working two jobs most of his life to ensure everyone was provided for.

Don dedicated 28 years of service to the United States Air Force, retiring with the rank of Senior Master Sergeant. He excelled in fabrication support, served as an instructor, and worked as a Nondestructive Inspection Technician. A hero to many, Don was known for his sharp wit and knack for making others smile. Whether sharing a random fact, telling a joke, or offering advice, he had a way of leaving a lasting impression. He was teacher, mentor, and jokester who could turn any conversation into a moment of laughter.

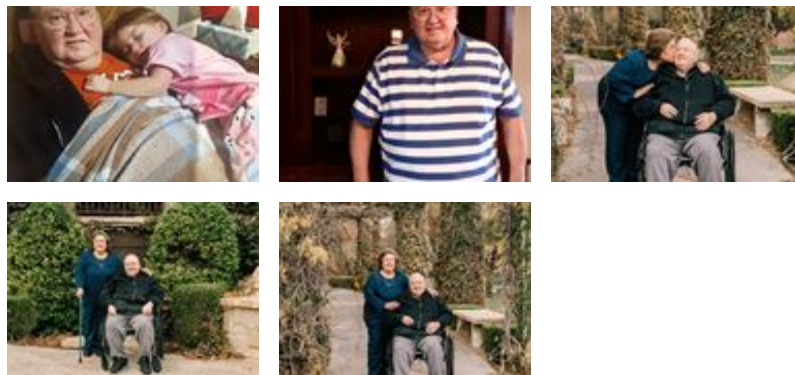
