



Dorothy Faye Williamson

November 30, 1923 - October 3, 2018

Dorothy Faye Williamson was born November 30, 1923 in Mexia, Texas, to William Rufus Byers and Martha Estella De Vore. She died on October 3, 2018.

She was the fifth child out of six. She graduated valedictorian from Wolfforth High School in 1941. Dorothy married Jackie Hoyt Williamson of Lubbock, Texas on August 15, 1942. They had a daughter Sandra Faye Williamson. Jackie Hoyt Williamson preceded her in death on October 6, 2001.

Dorothy was a tireless volunteer in the community and at the churches she attended. Early on she was a Sunday school teacher and Director of children's ministry at Trinity Baptist. She was at Hurlwood Baptist Church for over 30 years till Reese Air Force Base closed at which time she came to Red Bud Baptist in 2003. She continued to volunteer with the women's ministry in preparing Angel Food boxes to give to the community in need of food. Several months after Dorothy and Jack were married in 1942, Jack was deployed into WWII. Dorothy then went to be a Rosie the Riveter for B-29 Super fortress in Kansas City, Camp Hale in Denver, and finally in California until Jack returned in 1945. In 1970 Dorothy was tired of being a cotton classifier supervisor at the Lubbock Cotton Office. She decided at the age of 47 to follow her passion for assisting others and entered Methodist School of Nursing. She graduated in 1973 top of her class at age 50. She went to work at the Pavilion for 26

years for Dr. Deshawn and Dr. Phillipone as an OB/GYN nurse until retirement in 1989.

Dorothy was preceded in death by her parents, her husband Jackie of 59 years, one brother William Odell Byers, four sisters, Opal Morrison, Oattie Chester, Orabelle Ham, and Mildred (Micky) Rush.

Dorothy is survived by her daughter Sandra Faye Olsen, San Clemente California, her grandchildren Jacque Jauregui Lubbock Texas, and Roy turner Lubbock Texas, many great-grandchildren and many more great-great-grandchildren.
