



## Fae Elizabeth Halley

May 25, 1920 - June 29, 2014

Fae Elizabeth Rogers Halley, 94, passed away on June 29, 2014. She was delivered by Dr. John Rouse DO on May 25, 1920 in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. Her parents were Stanley Kendall Rogers and Gracie Melvina Davis Rogers. Fae grew up in Oklahoma City where she attended Classen High School.

She began college at Chevy Chase Junior College, a school for young women in Chevy Chase, Maryland. Later she transferred to the University of Oklahoma where she was a member of Kappa Kappa Gamma sorority. While at the University of Oklahoma, she met the love of her life David Graham Halley. They were married on January 1, 1940.

In 1951 she moved with her growing family to Lubbock. There she and David established David G. Halley & Co., Inc., a manufacturer's representative business, dealing in heating and air conditioning products. She worked actively in the company through her eighties.

She and David were among the first members of St. Stephen's Episcopal Church, and she continued to attend and support the church for the next fifty-six years. She served on the altar guild and contributed in various other areas. She is survived by her four children and their spouses: Barbara Linder of Tigard, Oregon; Sally Loden and her husband Gary of Lubbock; David Halley, Jr. of Austin; and Mike Halley and his wife Dyann of Lubbock. She is also survived by eight grandchildren and twelve great grandchildren.

Fae and David were blessed with an amazing seventy-two year love affair and

a remarkably active and healthy life together.

Fae will be remembered as a loving and devoted wife and mother. With her family she enjoyed various water sports, particularly sailing. She and David loved to share their passion for sailing with family and friends. They kept their boat on Lake Amistad where they sailed and raced. Fae even served as commodore of the Amistad Yacht Club.
