Frances Evalyn Bull Compton Grubbs, 99, passed away January 21, 2015 in Lubbock, Texas. She was born on September 6, 1915 in Lubbock, Texas to William Bull and Mattie Peden Bull. Evalyn was in the first graduating class of the new Lubbock High School in 1933. She married J.S. Compton when she was 20 years old, then moved to Fort Worth, Texas, where she lived for most of her life.

During WWII, Evalyn worked at Douglas Airplane Manufacture putting the front spars on B-52 bombers. She attended Texas Christian University, and acquired her Texas Dental Assistant Degree in 1945. Evalyn earned her National Certification into the American Dental Assistants Association in 1952, and served as President of Texas Dental Assistants in 1965. She received many awards of recognition during her career of 35+ years.

Evalyn was a devout Christian who loved the Lord. She was an active member of Travis Avenue Baptist Church, attending and tithing consistently, as well as participating in the church choir. She was very generous in helping her family all throughout her life, as well as others in need. Upon her retirement, she volunteered at the Plaza Medical Center as a Hospitality person, earning a 2000 Hours of Service award.

Evalyn also traveled extensively, enjoying many trips nationally and abroad with her husband J.S., various travel groups, and her sister, Lucye Prcin. A few years after her husband died, Evalyn married E.I. Grubbs. The enjoyed 15

years of retirement together before his passing in 2005.

Evalyn returned to Lubbock for the latter part of her life to be close to her remaining family. Surviving members are sister Lucye Prcin, nephews Larry Prcin, Randy Prcin, Sam Bull, and Henry McDaniel. She is welcomed into gods kingdom by brothers William Bull and Luther Bull and sister Elsie McDaniel.

Evalyn was dynamic, hard working, faithful and strong. She always strove to better herself, and carried with her a great sense of humor. She touched many lives of countless people, and she will be dearly missed.
