Gary was born on February 26, 1947 in Upland, California to Carrie and William Mattox. At the age of 4, the family moved to Clovis, New Mexico which was a town Gary loved. During his sophomore year of high school, the family moved to Abilene, Texas where Gary graduated from Abilene Cooper High School. Gary went on to attend Texas Tech University where he played basketball his freshman year. In 1970, he received his Bachelor of Science in Physical Education. Gary met his wife Judy while working in Glorieta, New Mexico in 1966, and later married on August 30, 1968. For 25 years, Gary worked for Methodist Hospital, 6 years at Agnew Associates and after 13 years, he retired from Texas Tech Health Sciences Center. Gary enjoyed building stage sets for Christmas and Easter musicals at FBC Lubbock. Gary also enjoyed traveling with the FBC youth choir group for many years.
