She was an accomplished oil painter and treated her two Lubbock grandchildren to oil painting lessons and sleepovers when they were in school. Jo loved a beautiful yard and enjoyed tending to her plants. She

loved many cats and dogs in her life, most recently her cat Toby, now deceased, and her dog Lady who is now in the care of her granddaughter and husband along with her cousin-dog Paisley.

As a young mother she led groups of Brownies and Girl Scouts, taught Sunday school, and spent many hours watching her children's competitive rollerskating practices and competitions. She was an excellent seamstress and made many of her daughter's costumes for competitions. She enjoyed her son's baseball and football practices and games and was a favorite mom among her children's friends.

Before moving to Lubbock in 1971, Jo worked in the office at Sears in Temple and Abilene, Texas. She also worked for McMurray University in Abilene, Dallas Baptist College and for Eunice Kennedy Shriver's Special Olympics.

She was preceded in death by her husband of 59 years on May 28, 2000, and by her parents and her brother Veon Benedict. She is survived by her daughter Carolyn Hearn (Gale Campbell) of Floydada, son George Allen Hearn, Jr. of Fort Worth; four grandchildren: Tiffany Hernandez (Daniel) of Lubbock; and Trent Ulm and Jade Hearn of Fort Worth; Dustin Hearn of May; and four great grandchildren, Syde, Blaze, Kace and Ryker Hearn of Fort Worth.
