Irene Chapman, a longtime Lubbock resident, passed away Oct 27, 2018, at the age of 96. A graveside service will be held, Tuesday, October 30, 2018, 2:00 PM, at the City of Lubbock Cemetery. She was born Pittsburg, PA and grew up in nearby Ambridge, PA. Her mother died while she was very young and two aunts helped her father raise her. After graduation from Ambridge High School, she moved to Washington, DC and worked for the Treasury Dept. That was at the beginning of World War II. She spent the war years in DC, and while a difficult time for everyone, she found her time there very exciting. While there, she met a young Army officer from Texas who was on leave, Harold Chapman. He spent the war years overseas, but at its conclusion, he returned to DC, bought a car, married Irene in Maryland in 1946, and they drove to Lubbock. He went into the real estate business with his father, JW Chapman & brother Ray Chapman. She became a Texan and lived the rest of her life in Lubbock.

They had two sons, John & Joe, and she was a loving mother & wife. She spent her time raising them and doing volunteer work for various organizations. After her husband's death, she managed family real estate and financial matters. She is predeceased by her husband, son Joe, her parents, a sister, and two brothers. She is survived by John Chapman and his wife Isabelle of Houston; Joe's wife Jackie Chapman, grandson Tyler, & granddaughter Delaney, all of Katy, TX.X.
