



## Jack Kornegay

June 18, 1921 - July 8, 2016

Jack Kornegay was born June 18, 1921 to A.W. and Ruby Kornegay on a farm near Duke, Oklahoma. He attended Duke schools and graduated from Duke High School in May of 1939.

They moved to a farm near Kress, Texas in the fall of 1939. There was no money for college so he volunteered into the U.S. Army Air Force, on September 14, 1940 and achieved the rank of Master Sergeant. He was responsible for maintenance on 500 twin engine bomber planes, and then was discharged in October of 1945, after five years of service.

Following WWII, he became involved in the automotive industry, worked for Nissan (Datsun) as a regional parts and service manager for all of southern California and the complete state of Arizona.

An additional money incentive, initiated a move to Lubbock and employment with the RV industry with Clark Equipment Corp, they later sold-out to Alco-Standard Corporation. Jack worked as their National Parts Service Manager until October 1974. He was then employed by Hearst Publishing Co., traveling about one fourth of the state of Texas as a Publishers Representative.

He retired on June 30, 1983, he joined Agape UMC in January of 2006.

He is survived by one niece, three nephews, three great nieces, two great nephews, four great-great nieces, and four great-great nephews.

Jack's positive, happy spirit, as well as his ability to inspire and encourage will be only two of the major gifts that will be missing, following Jack's death. May he rest in peace and contentment with his Lord.
