Elbert Lee (Jack) Moss, Jr. departed this life on September 11th, 2024. He was born on August 3rd, 1934 at Klondike, South of Lamesa, Texas to Elbert Moss, Sr. and Myrtle Moss. He was preceded in death by his parents, five brothers: Troy, Lefty, Perry, Kenneth, and Pud, and daughter-in-law Lori Moss.

Jack graduated from Klondike High School in 1951. Following graduation from McMurry College in Abilene, Texas, he married Sandra Medford in 1955. He was in the US Army from 1956-1958.

Jack was employed, and later became a partner in the local CPA firm of Bolinger, Segars, Gilbert, and Moss where he continued to work until April 15th of this year. He loved working with the firm's clients and enjoyed frequent breakfasts with his friends. He was an avid sports fan of Texas Tech University where he frequently attended baseball, basketball, football, and track events. He always enjoyed being a part of the crowd and the excitement of the game, often while listening to another game over his handheld radio. Jack taught High School boys Sunday School Classes at both Highland Baptist Church and First Baptist Church in Abernathy, Texas.

Jack was a wonderful husband, father, and grandfather. He had a colorful sense of humor and always endeavored to make people smile. He never forgot a joke or story to illustrate a point and would always be sure to

remember one told to him, especially if he'd never heard it before.

Survivors include his wife, Sandra, of 69 years, daughter Valerie Graves of Lubbock, son Kenneth Moss of Louisville, Ky., and grandchildren Aaron Griffith (Ileana) of Lubbock, Austin Moss (Hiromi) of Louisville, Ky., Brandon Moss of Silver Springs, Maryland, Katherine Moss of Chicago, Illinois and two great grandchildren, Aria and Rey.

At Jack's 90th birthday, South Plains Rehabilitation Hospital was gracious enough to allow the family to host his party on August 3rd.
