



Jewell Ethel Williams Hatton

Services for Jewell Ethel Hatton will be held at 11:00 a.m. on Tuesday, April 12, 2016, in Sanders Memorial Chapel. Interment will follow at Resthaven Memorial Park. Jewell left her earthly body to meet her Lord and Savior on Friday, April 8, 2016 in Lubbock, Texas.

Jewell Hatton was born on January 19, 1917 in Bonita, Texas to Claud Sheridan Williams and Mary Ethel (Tarr) Williams. Jewell was preceded in death by her husband of 45 years, Ernest Carter Hatton, Sr.; her parents; four brothers, Omer, Phillip, Paul, and Cecil Williams; two sisters, Etta Mae Pilcher and Faye Littlefield; one daughter, Margie Chism; and one grandson, Bradley Carter Hatton.
