Juan Segura, 66, of Lubbock passed away Friday, August 7, 2015. He was born December 6, 1948 in Lubbock, Texas. He graduated from Lubbock High School in 1968 and served in the United States Army during the Vietnam War from 1969-70. He was awarded the Bronze Star. Juan worked for 38 years as a dental tech for Trippe Porcelain Labs and Technicare before retiring in 2009. Juan is survived by his two sons, Timothy J Segura and wife Susie and Manuel J.

Segura and wife Roselyn; grandchildren, Johnathon, Maricel, Xavier and Isabella; and the children's mother, Linda Segura, sister Adela Brito and husband Benny Brito.

Rosary will be held at 7:00 p.m., Tuesday, August 11, 2015 at Our Lady of Grace Catholic Church. *He had recently returned from Army service in Viet Nam. He was a great guy, with a willingness to help anyone he could. He was a man of peace and integrity.
