me.*

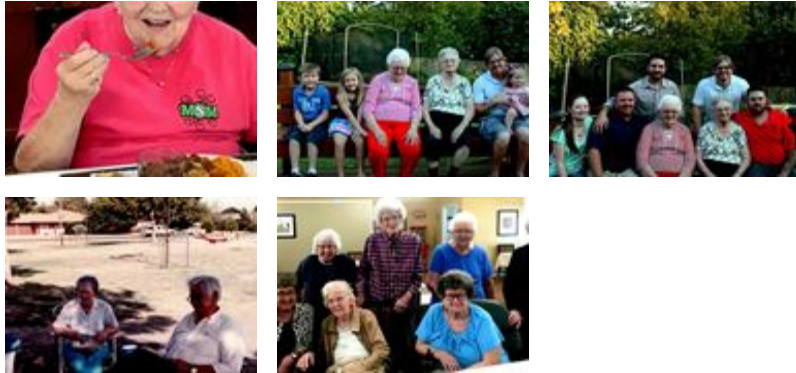
*One of my many blessings in this journey of life was being able to

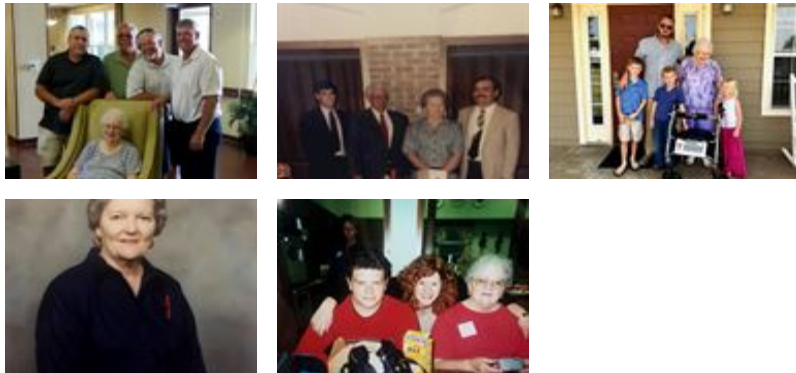

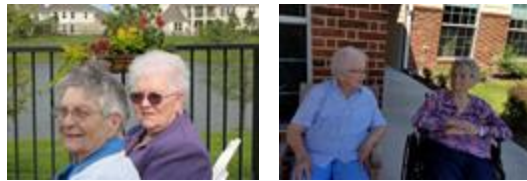
