



Judy Parker Campbell

April 21, 1945 - January 4, 2014

Memorial services for Judy Parker Campbell, devoted mother and grandmother will be at 10:00 a.m., Tuesday, January 7, 2014 in Sanders Memorial Chapel with the Reverend Melissa Wafer-Cross officiating. She died January 4, 2014 in Lubbock.

She was born the youngest of ten children on April 21, 1945, in Lamesa, Texas to the late Steve and Katie Parker of New Moore, Texas. She graduated from Isabell Powell Beauty School in 1963 and worked as a hair stylist until 1968. She later became a Southwestern Bell long distance operator, finishing her training on the day of the Lubbock tornado, May 11, 1970. In the early 1970's she also worked as a floral designer for Margie's Flowers in Lamesa, Texas. Beginning in the mid 1970s she became a PBX operator for a newly arrived company in Lubbock known as Texas Instruments. She continued her career as a PBX operator/receptionist with Nunn Electric for several years before moving to the law firm, Crenshaw, Dupree & Milam for the next 18 years, where she was known as "the voice of CD&M". Judy retired from CD&M in December 2006 due to her deteriorating health. She suffered a stroke in July 2007, but she continued to be the same wonderful, loving "Judy-Judy" until her death.

Survivors include a daughter, Michele Campbell of Lubbock; a grandson, Cutter Campbell; daughter-in-law, Michelle Campbell all of Lubbock; four sisters, Terrye Parker Brown and Bobbye Parker Vogler both of Lamesa; Margaret Parker Jack of Lubbock, and Christene Parker Albright of Nebraska,

and numerous nieces, nephews, and dear friends.

Judy was preceded in death by her son, Cory Campbell; by four brothers and one sister, Donald Lynn Parker, Leon Davis Parker, Lewis Steve Parker, Emmett Vernon Parker and Wanda Jean Parker Chancy.
