Karen Schulze, 64, of Lubbock, Texas passed away on November 23, 2023. Karen was born August 9, 1959 in Bakersfield, CA to Erwin and Ramona Schulze. Her family moved to Lubbock in 1964. Karen graduated from Lubbock High School in 1977; attended Concordia Lutheran College in Austin and graduated from the University of Texas-Austin with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Mechanical Engineering in 1986. Karen was one of only five women in her graduating class of sixty-nine students. Karen worked in the semiconductor industry for many years with Hewlett Packard, MCC and Motorola in Portland Oregon and Austin, TX; she later worked for the Internal Revenue Service in Austin. She returned to Lubbock in 2016 to be with her family.

Loved ones include brother, Dennis Schulze and wife, Nancy; sister, Kathryn Rogers; sister, Janice Honerkamp and husband, Russell; nieces, Brittany Rogers and Ellie Rogers; nephews, Rowdy Rogers and Tyler Kubisz and many aunts, uncles and cousins.

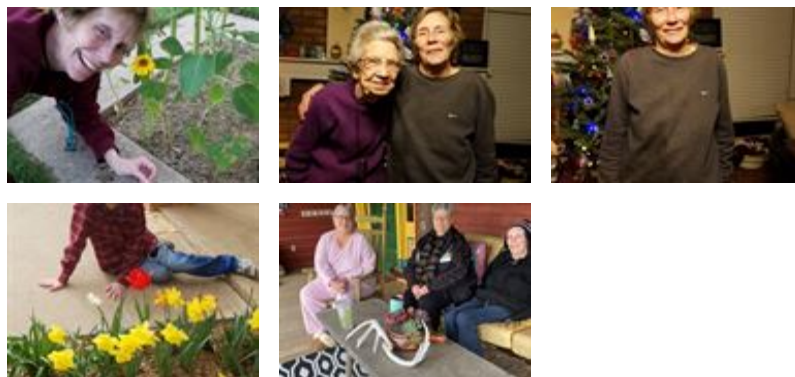
