



## Manuel Carrillo

June 20, 1965 - February 10, 2021

Manuel “Manny” Carrillo passed away to be with his Lord and Savior on Wednesday February 10, 2021 at the age of 55 after a long and courageous battle against COVID-19. When Manny found out he had COVID-19, he sought every reasonable means of treatment to restore health and maintain a good quality of life. When it became clear that this was not feasible, Manny alongside Family thanked the Baylor Scott and White medical team and moved on to enable him to have a brief window of time prior to riding off on his motorcycle in to the sunset.

Mass of Christian Burial will be celebrated for Manny at 10:00 a.m., Saturday, February 20, 2021 at Saint Thomas the Apostle Church in Amarillo. A celebration of life service will be at 2:00 p.m., Sunday, February 21, 2021 at Sanders Memorial Chapel in Lubbock.

Manuel "Manny" Carrillo was born in Piedras Negras, Coahuila, Mexico on June 20, 1965. He graduated from Clover Park Vocational Technical Institute from Tacoma, Washington. Manny served as a Corporal in the U.S. Army from October of 1985 until October of 1988. He married Stephanie C. Adcock on August 8, 1998. Manny's law enforcement career included being a Correctional Officer, Public Safety Officer and Detention Officer. Manny went back to school to earn his Bachelor of Science degree of Speech-Language and Hearing Sciences from the Texas Tech University Health Science Center in 2007. This led to his career as a Licensed Speech Language Pathology Assistant.

Manny enjoyed riding his motorcycle, cooking meats and holiday meals, and spending time with his family. He was a member of the Lubbock Patriot Guard chapter and other various Veteran support groups as able. He was a devoted member of Holy Spirit Catholic Church of Lubbock.
