After 2 marriages and an engagement she was blessed with 4 sons and 1 daughter which were her pride and joy. She loved to brag about her children and grandchildren. She spent 30 years of her life with her second husband, Jose Carlos Bermudez, on the beautiful island of Vieques, Puerto Rico. She loved good, tasty food and the art of cooking. She loved music and the art of dancing having attended the Arthur Murray School of dance in Germany. 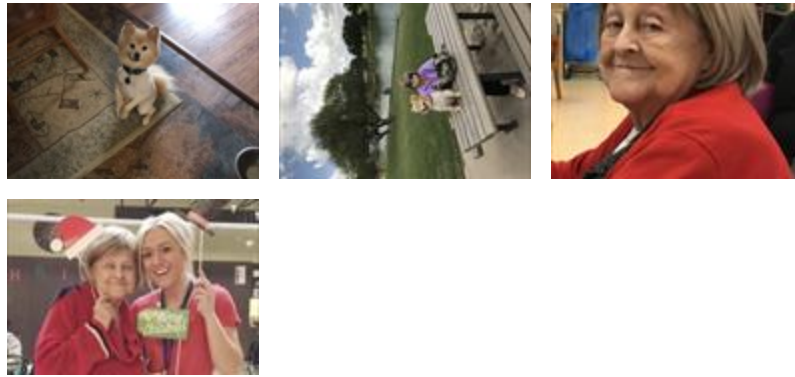
