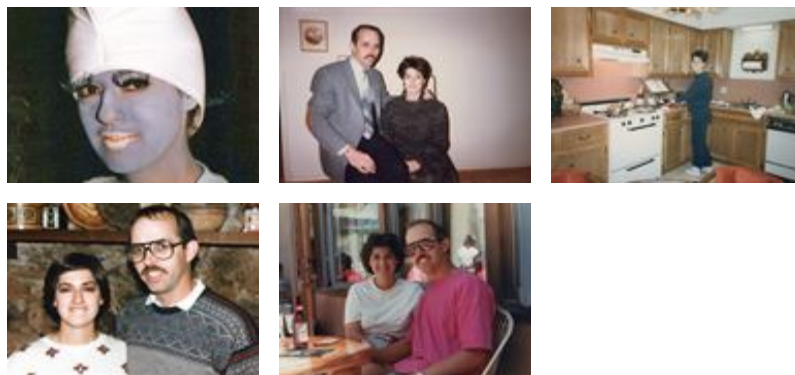

My heart filled up and I went home proud of myself.
