Morris Bryan of Lubbock passed away April 5th, 2014 at the age of 55.

Visitation will be held at Sanders Funeral Home, Friday, April 11th from 5-7 PM with the memorial service being held on Saturday, April 12th at 10 AM at the First Baptist Church. Morris was born October 22nd, 1958 in Lubbock.

Morris attended Coronado High School and graduated in 1977. While there he excelled in wood working and went to state competitions in Austin several times. Love for wood working and creating with his hands led to multiple occupations in cabinet making and worked with his dad in a home remodeling business. This later led to Morris building his own home.

Morris was a Superintendent for Lee Lewis Construction for approximately 12 years. He worked on multiple Lubbock Independent School District projects, Livingston Hearing Center, and Vista Banks in Lubbock specializing in the unique domes in these new facilities. He also led the development and construction of the Bayer Museum of Agriculture, which contains restored tractors, farm equipment, cotton gin equipment, and numerous displays of the world of agricultural in west Texas.

One of his passions when not working was cooking, which involved cooking competitions for chili, brisket, and ribs. Most of these were for key charities such as Casa.

Morris is survived by his son, Chad Bryan; mother, Grace Ann Bryan; father, James Bryan; sister, Billie Dickerson and husband Lee; 3 nieces; 1 grand

nephew; and 2 aunts.
