Robert graduated from Ropes High School in 1946 and attended Texas Technological College before completing the carpenters apprenticeship program, following in the footsteps of his father and brothers. After retirement, Robert served as a crossing guard for the City of Lubbock. He was a former board member of Southern Little League Baseball. 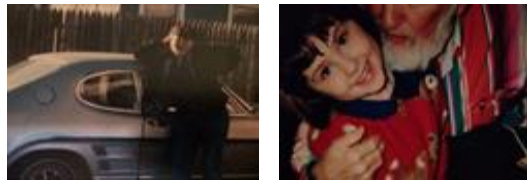
