December 7, 1924 - April 15, 2013

Bob went to be with his Lord and Savior on April 15, 2013.

Bob was born December 7, 1924 in Portia, Arkansas to William Walton and Bertha Louise Clark. He graduated from Ysleta High School in El Paso. Bob was in the U.S. Army during World War II serving in the European Theater. He married Willeen Anderson on December 22, 1946, in Lubbock, TX. Bob was a co-founder of Brandon and Clark, Inc. with his step-father, Basil Brandon and brother, Bill Clark, in 1950. He was a member of First Baptist Church, the Downtown Bible Class, the Lubbock Masonic Lodge and a charter member Lubbock Monterey AMBUCS.

Bob was preceded in death by his parents; his wife, Willeen, on January 10, 1995; infant son, John Randall, and brothers, Bill and Fayne Clark.
