Stephen Harrell Bryant passed away Friday ,November 6, 2020 in his home at the age of 79 after a lengthy battle with cancer. 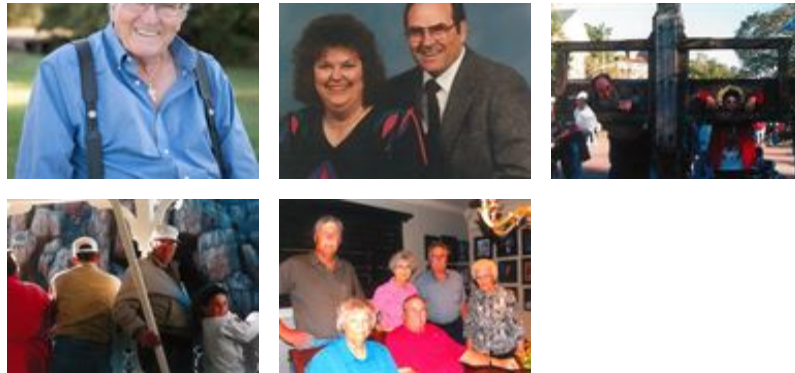

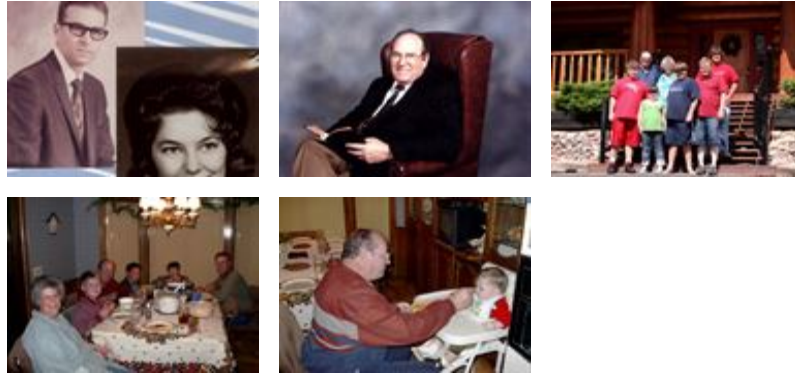
