



Thomas "Tom" B Moore

August 12, 1947 - March 31, 2021

Thomas "Tom" B Moore, 73, passed away on March 31, 2021, in Lubbock, Texas, his birthplace and long-time home. Tom was born on August 12, 1947, to George T. Moore and Ruby Moore, née Mauldin. He was the eldest of three brothers. He graduated from Lubbock High School and attended Texas Tech University for two years before enlisting in the United States Air Force. While in the Air Force, he met Carla Howard while they were both working part-time at Pizza Hut. They were married in Abilene, Texas, on August 23, 1969. Upon completing his military service, Tom and Carla moved to Lubbock, where he completed a degree from Texas Tech. He took a job with Swift and Company in San Antonio and moved several times before returning to Lubbock in 1976. Tom then worked for AT&T/Southwestern Bell until he retired.

Tom volunteered throughout his life for different organizations, including the Telephone Pioneers Association, the Muscular Dystrophy Association, the Boy Scouts of America, and Friends of the Lubbock Library. For 17 years, he served as an advisor for the Beta Sigma Chapter of Alpha Phi Omega, a brotherhood that he cherished. Tom also represented his fellow telephone workers as an elected member of four bargaining teams for the Communication Workers of America (CWA). He felt deeply the importance of service and a sense of fairness.

Tom was a loyal friend to many and a stranger to none. He appreciated music and enjoyed telling and retelling band stories from Lubbock High and Texas Tech. He loved his family and was very proud to be a Papaw to his

grandchildren.

Tom was predeceased by his parents and brother Paul Moore. He is survived by his wife, Carla Moore; son Thomas "Thom" Moore and wife Stephanie of Colorado Springs, Colorado; daughter Gwendolyn Moore of Lubbock; grandchildren Anna Moore and Nathaniel Moore of Colorado Springs; brother David Moore and wife Karen of Garland, Texas.

Sanders Funeral Home will direct services. The family will receive visitors on Monday, April 5, 5:00-6:30pm. A funeral service will be held Tuesday, April 6, at 1:00pm with burial following at Resthaven Memorial Park. The family requests for those attending to wear masks.

“ I met Tom at a meeting of Communications Workers of America more than 30 years ago, he representing his Local in Lubbock and me from Oklahoma City. We served together as two of six elected bargaining committee members for CWA , negotiating the 1989 Agreement between CWA and SW Bell Telephone Company and the subsequent 2001 Agreement between CWA and SBC.

If you ever wonder about how to get to know someone well, work on a bargaining committee for three months at some distant location. We all took meals together, met during daytime and nighttime, argued and cajoled each other to support our individual perspectives on issues we needed to settle on behalf of our Membership.

Tom was a solid rock of knowledge, generous in sharing his vast experience in contract negotiations. We bonded instantly as the only smokers on the Union committee. Actually, we settled a lot of questions outside during "smoke breaks".

Long after our bargaining days had ended, I kept in touch with Tom and Carla because we still had a lot in common and had developed a friendship that lasted many years. I even spent five days in Lubbock as a guest at the Moore home around Christmas. What a grand time we had, I learned ALL ABOUT Texas Tech and enjoyed a great time with two of the kindest people I had met in my many travels.

Over the years, I learned about the kids, Thom and Gwen, and eventually the Grandkids. Tom posted lots of photos on Facebook and kept me and his many other friends up to date on the family. And, entertained with his dry wit and sarcasm.

After Tom, Carla, and I retired, we continued to drift along on parallel paths. I in OKC volunteering with the Friends of the Library OKC and Tom in Lubbock helping to increase the success of the Lubbock Friends of the Library. I called Tom and Carla a month or two ago, spoke for well over an hour to catch up. There is simply

nothing better than chatting with old, distant friends..just to be sure they are still well and happy.

Tom will be missed by many friends and his loving family. I will miss him too.
