



Wallace Gerald Haney

March 21, 1921 - October 29, 2024

Wallace Gerald "Doc" Haney, 103, received his eternal reward on Tuesday October 29th, 2024 after a brief illness. He is blessed to rejoin his beloved wife "Lou" who preceded him in death.

Wallace was born on March 21st, 1921 in Ira, Texas to W.A. and Murial Haney, the eldest of five children. After graduating high school in 1939, he attended Texas Technological College until he enlisted in the Army Air Corps in February of 1941. He was stationed in numerous locations during his service and was qualified to pilot sixteen different aircraft including the B-29 Superfortress. He was honorably discharged with the rank of Captain.

He was married to Ellen Larue "Lou" McCowen by the base Chaplain at Foster Field in Victoria, Texas in 1942. They remained together until her death in 2010.

After completing his military service in April of 1946 he graduated from the Baylor School of Dentistry in Dallas. He practiced general dentistry in Lubbock for over thirty years. He was a devoted member of Southcrest Baptist Church and spent his leisure time on the golf course at Hillcrest Country Club.

He is survived by two daughters Ellen and her husband Howard Nevitt of Seattle, WA and Patricia Callan of Lubbock. He is also survived by one son

Bryan and his wife Deb of Victoria, TX. He was blessed with seven grandchildren and numerous great grandchildren.

In addition to his dear wife, he was preceded in death by his parents, three sisters, a brother and his eldest son Wallace, Jr. of Lubbock.

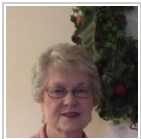
