June 9, 1921 - March 31, 2016

Wanda Evelyn (Dodson) Whitted of San Antonio passed away yesterday, Thursday, March 31, 2016 at her home at Heartland Care of San Antonio. She was 94 years old. Wanda was born in Sweetwater, Texas on June 9, 1921 to George W. Dodson and Nellie E. (McCasland) Dodson, she was the oldest of 5 children.

Wanda is survived by her three children B.J. Harvey and her Husband John of Dallas, Marty Spence of San Antonio and Sandy Allen of Austin. Great Great Grandchildren Rylee McCrary Ramos and new baby sister Reece. Wanda was preceded in death by her Mother and father and 5 siblings. She has one remaining Sister in law Retha Dodson of Kingsland, Tx. Wanda is also survived by numerous Nieces & Nephews.

As a child, Wanda lived in San Saba, Post , Sweetwater, Lubbock & Brownfield, Tx. After she married Wanda & her husband George E. Whitted lived in Abilene , Tx in the 1940's where their 3 children were born and moved to Snyder, Texas during the 1950's. She was a member of the First Baptist

Church of Snyder and of the local Easter Star Chapter. After a brief few years in Tuba City, AZ she and her children moved to Midland, Tx. where Wanda raised her 3 daughters. During the time she lived in Midland she was a member of the Bellview Baptist Church for many years. After moving to Lubbock for a few years she later returned to Midland, owned & ran her own Square Dance apparel shop, Squares & Flares, where she made clothes of all types concentrating on Square Dance apparel. Wanda loved to Square Dance and belonged to several groups throughout the years in Midland, Lubbock, and Austin. She was one of the Charter Members of the Solo Squares of Lubbock which she helped organize in 1972. They had their 44th Anniversary Dance, Saturday Night, April 2, 2016 in Lubbock. Wanda was very proud of this club and the 6 members who started it. She moved to Austin and she retired in 1997 in San Antonio but continued her sewing in her home for friends and family. She was a member of the Shearer Hills Baptist Church, San Antonio, Tx.

Wanda was a feisty little lady although only 5' tall. Several words used by family and friends to describe Wanda are remarkable, awesome, determined and one of a kind little lady. "Rest in Peace Momma, we will miss you dearly". “ I can't remember the time that Aunt Wanda wasn't there at least in the background of my life. I remember the visits to see her family when we were kids. Being one of the younger cousins and the youngest there at the time, I was thrilled when I was allowed to wear the girls' beautiful dancing costumes. Aunt Wanda was one of the most accomplished seamstresses I have ever known and to be able to inherit the girls' hand-me-downs she made was better by far than getting a 'store boughten' dress! Later on, I loved it when she would let me take a 'tour' of her beautiful square dance dresses and was always secretly jealous of the miles and miles of colorful crinoline petticoats!!!! When she and the girls came to live with us while they got back on their feet after the divorce, there were nine of us in that little three bedroom/one bathroom house. Daddy used to joke that with four teen age girls in the house, getting bathroom time was near impossible, and though the cramped quarters seemed to play on everyone else's nerves from time to time, it was like a giant slumber party to me. Aunt Wanda had this infectious cackle of a laugh and when you heard it, you knew there was fun and/or mischief afoot. Loved hearing her tell wonderful stories about when she and Daddy were kids...lots of her laughing going on then, too. She would babysit us on the few occasions Mom and Dad went out of town, usually for business conferences. I always told everyone that Aunt Wanda could see and know more about what was going on and who was doing what with her one good eye than most other mothers with two good eyes! I will never forget the day I came home from school in Midland and found her and Mom in the back yard making plaster of Paris plaques for Vacation Bible School. They had Daddy's saw horses up with boards across them and there had to have been several hundred little plaques drying in the sun. Aunt Wanda and Mom were going to make them for their class handcraft and when word got out among the other teachers, everyone else wanted them, too, so they just made them for everyone that year. It is probably the cynosure that made me realize the importance of Vacation Bible School and for many years, I also made hundreds of plaster plaques because of them. I remember that year, everyone raved about Aunt Wanda's and Mom's VBS class being the best

they'd ever seen and what a wonderful time their kids had but they didn't just have fun, they learned, too...they were amazing when they put their heads together on a project and you can bet your life it would be done to complete perfection. No slacking when those two were on the job!!! Didn't get to spend much time with Aunt Wanda in the past several decades with raising kids and all that involves, but she will always have a special place in my heart for her part in making some wonderful childhood memories. I would like to say 'rest in peace', but I just imagine there is far too much catching up to do with Muzzie and Grandad, Daddy and Mom, Nona, Weasie, and Darrell to be resting. I bet you can hear that wonderful cackle all around Heaven these days! God bless.
