Lubbock, TX- The family will gather at Broadway Church of Christ on Wednesday, January 7, 2015 at 1:30 pm for visitation and a memorial service to begin at 3:00 to celebrate the life of Wayne Holt. Wayne was born May 6, 1933 in Olney, TX to Arthur Judson Holt and Flora Irene Holt. He graduated from Olney High School in 1951. He attended Paris Junior College and graduated from Abilene Christian College. While at ACC, he met Patsy Hufstedler while on a blind date and said "I am going to marry that girl," even though he could not remember her last name when he would call her dorm to ask her for a date. They married on October 8, 1955 at the Broadway Church of Christ and were married for 59 years. Wayne owned and operated Hufstedler Truck Co. in Lubbock. He moved to Austin, Texas in 1996 and worked with his son Mark at Star Customs until he retired in 2008. He moved back to Lubbock in August of 2013. He was baptized in 1954 while a student at ACC and was a member of the Church of Christ. He taught the junior high boy's Sunday school class and also served as an elder at the Broadway Church of Christ. He sat on the board of the Lubbock Children's Home and on the board of trustees at Abilene Christian University. He also coached all four of his sons' Little League baseball teams. He is survived by his wife Patsy; sons Richard and his wife Kathy, Mark and his wife Brenda, Mike, Ragan and his wife Cherie; ten grandchildren and five great-grandchildren who will
