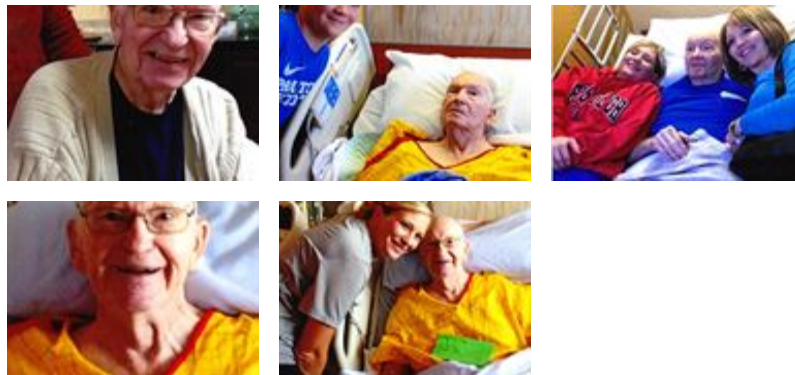

“ My memories of my uncle Bill go back 50+ years to the house he owned on Dartmouth Avenue. I'll share some of my earliest. I loved visiting his house. I loved climbing up what seemed to be a mountain of concrete steps (there actually only four) that lead up to the front door of his home and then knocking at the screen door for either Bill or Joyce to answer. There was always a big plastic glass of orange koolaid or a small bottle of coke given to us before being encouraged to go play outside. I can still see Bill working in his workshop. An assortment of hammers, clippers, and other tools hanging on the walls all around him...and I remember him taking time to explain to me how each of them work and how he used them. I remember his voice, his distinct uncle Bill voice, when I was approaching that line I was not supposed to "step over". I remember empty threats that he would "tan my hide" if I get out of line. My punishment was always being tickled until I couldn't breathe or to the point of almost wetting myself. I remember his big arms around me if I'd gotten hurt, his reassurances when the hurt was in my heart, and always, always, always his big uncle Bill smiles. I miss you uncle Bill!
