



## William Homer Jackson

December 29, 1942 - August 10, 2023

William Homer Jackson, 80, of Lubbock, Texas passed away August 10, 2023, in his home surrounded by his wife, children and grandchildren. Homer was born December 29, 1942, in Amarillo to Delmer and Leoda Jackson. He was the second oldest of ten children. At age 2 they moved to Rogers and then to a farm in Heidenheimer. Homer attended school in Academy and graduated in 1961. He went on to Temple Junior College and then to Abilene Christian College where he received a Bachelor of Science in Education. Two weeks after graduation on June 3rd, 1967, he married Regina Ann Manning of Temple and they were married for 56 years. That same year they began their teaching careers at Garland Christian Schools, a part of Dallas Christians Schools. In 1969, he was drafted into the United States Army where he served as an instructor over the next three years in Fort Monmouth, NJ and then Baumholder, Germany. After serving in the military, they moved to Temple, where he was a teacher and coach for the next ten years. It was during this time that he received his Masters in Administration from Prairie View A&M University. He then moved his family to Gainesville to teach and coach. After a year, a business opportunity led the family to move to Midland. Not long after, he returned to coaching where he spent the next eight years coaching at Midland Christian High School, before beginning a remodeling business that he continued until his retirement to Lubbock in 2019.
