



Wilma Jean Valdez

February 19, 1937 - April 21, 2025

Wilma Jean (Zeller) Valdez, 88, of Idalou, Texas, departed this life on April 21, 2025, after a lengthy illness. She was a dairy farmer and a Seventh-day Adventist.

Wilma was born to Kenneth Leroy Zeller and Wilhelmina Christina (Weber) Zeller on February 19, 1937, at home on the family farm in Beloit, Ohio. Always a music-lover, she would loudly sing when working the fields. She soon joined the church choir. She graduated from Alliance High School in 1955, the first in her family to do so. In 1962, she left the farm and traveled across the country in her 1960 Studebaker Lark VI convertible to California to work in her aunt's restaurant, accompanied only by her German Shepherd, Tracy. In California, she met "James" Alfonso Valdez, whom she married in 1964. Their 30-year union produced three children.

In 1971, the family moved to New Mexico, where Wilma began her own dairy farm with three Jerseys. From then on, even when the family moved (three more times), she maintained cattle and chickens. Additionally, she was a loving, strong, hard-working, and creative Christian mother who supported all her children's endeavors.

Wilma was preceded in death by her parents, a sister, Chrystal (Zeller) Rainey Conrad, two grandsons, Kallen and Lorren Valdez, a daughter-in-law, Camille

(Rabel) Valdez, and her ex-husband, James.

Left to cherish her memory are her children, Monica (Sam) Kennedy of Lubbock, Melba Valdez (Dan Jones) of Ruidoso, New Mexico, and Roger Valdez of Idalou; six grandchildren, and three great-grandchildren, as well as numerous nieces and nephews.
